- b. Generate three distinct concepts through pencil sketches based on the factors identified above. Present these pencil sketches along with brief notes (if necessary) in the space provided on page 20-21.
- c. Create your final concept and present this through drawing, showing the overall form and design of its features on page 22. Mention materials to be used for production of the opener and reasons for choosing the same.
